



# THE SCOTTISH HORSE MEMORIAL

Removed for Conservation



Erected in 1905 the Memorial commemorates the men of the Scottish Horse regiment who died in the South African War (1901–02).

It takes the form of a round-headed cross in red Peterhead granite, carved with a prominent claymore and lion rampant.

The cross rests upon a plinth of rough-cut blocks with inset bronze inscription panels. A similar version of the monument was erected in Johannesburg, SA.

The memorial is currently undergoing conservation. It will be re-erected on a new bastion nearby in 2011.

These works are being carried out on behalf of the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo Ltd in preparation for the completion of the new grandstands in 2011.
